#### **Recommended Board Action:**

Receive report on the result of the Public Hearing held on May 1, 2024, by the Sacramento Local Agency Formation Commission on the intent to initiate dissolution of Del Paso Manor Water District.

#### **Discussion:**

The Sacramento Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) held a Public Hearing on May 1, 2024, with a staff recommendation to approve the following:

- 1. Adopt CEQA Statutory Exemption §15061(b)(3) for the following two actions
- 2. Adopt the Addendum to the Municipal Service Review for Del Paso Manor Water District (LAFCo Project #2022-01); and
- 3. Serves as a Resolution of Intent to Initiate Dissolution of Del Paso Manor Water District. This resolution gives Del Paso Manor Water District a 12-month remediation period during which the district may take steps to remedy the specified deficiencies. At the end of that 12-month period, the Commission may either approve the dissolution of the Del Paso Manor Water District in May 2025, or rescind the Resolution of Intent to Initiate Dissolution, and no further action will be taken.

LAFCo staff's recommendation to initiate dissolution of the Del Paso Manor Water District (DPMWD) is based on a preponderance of evidence that DPMWD's service is not meeting industry standards, or government regulations, and is based on the 2021 Grand Jury Report, the adopted LAFCo Municipal Service Review (MSR), including the recommended MSR Addendum, and independent studies and information provided by DPMWD related to the current infrastructure. The recommendation is based on the further determination that DPMWD's Board is not actively engaged in efforts to remediate the documented service deficiencies.

LAFCo Commission Chair Rich Desmond began the meeting by reading a statement on the purpose and responsibility of LAFCo.

Jose Henriquez, LAFCo Executive Officer, conducted the presentation providing the necessary information to support the recommendation to adopt the subject resolution.

DPMWD Directors Dolk, Mattioli, Pratt, Ross, and General Manager Coyan were present at the meeting and provided comments during the Public Comment period.

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During Public Comment, DPMWD Directors Ross and Mattioli requested that the LAFCo Commission delay considering adopting the resolution so the Board and constituents can review and respond to the LAFCo report. Directors Dolk, Pratt, and DPMWD GM Coyan commented that they supported LAFCo's recommendation to adopt the resolution.

Each Commission Member made it very clear that they were not going to delay a decision that evening. They also made it clear to the DPMWD Board, by adopting the resolution it doesn't restrict that Board from doing their due diligence as Board members by choosing their path going forward. The Commission Members were very adamant on making the point that their major concern for DPMWD customers is their health, safety, and affordability of water, now and into the future.

Once the Public Comment period concluded, the LAFCo Commission, by a 7-0 vote, adopted LAFCo staff's recommendation, which adopts the Addendum to the Municipal Service Review for DPMWD and a Resolution of Intent to Initiate Dissolution of DPMWD.

#### **Recommended Board Action:**

Direct staff to develop a process for which to bring forth a vote to initiate reorganization tasks to dissolve Del Paso Manor Water District by combining under Sacramento Suburban Water District.

#### **Background:**

Since 2019, Sacramento Suburban Water District (SSWD) and Del Paso Manor Water District (DPMWD) have been in various discussions to combine the two districts, as well as SSWD operating DPMWD's water system by way of a Mutual Aid Agreement and an Operational Services Agreement. This was due to three of their four staff members retiring/resigning on May 31, 2019, as well as the 2021 Grand Jury Report.

Between 2020 and 2023, SSWD and DPMWD conducted an analysis on the following areas:

- Condition Assessment of DPMWD's Infrastructure
- Groundwater/Surface Water Supplies
- Municipal Services Review Updates
- Financial Analysis
- Water Rate Comparison
- Combination Benefits Rates, Costs, Operations
- Developed Pros and Cons

The above items were presented at the SSWD - DPMWD 2X2 Committee meetings, with report backs to the full Board of each agency. However, at the May 22, 2023 Joint Board meeting, the DPMWD Board of Directors made the decision to move forward with the Proposition 218 process and let their customers choose to pass a potential rate increase, or not.

#### **Discussion:**

On April 10, 2024, the Sacramento Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo), provided a Public Notice informing the public that LAFCo scheduled a Public Hearing on May 1, 2024, for the purpose of adopting an addendum to DPMWD's Municipal Services Review and adopt a Resolution of Intent to Initiate Dissolution of DPMWD.

On April 16, 2024, DPMWD held a Special Board meeting to discuss LAFCo's intent mentioned above. One of the options stated was to re-initiate discussions with SSWD. Per the minutes of

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DPMWD's Special Board meeting, the DPMWD Board of Directors voted to initiate discussions with SSWD. The vote was 3-1.

On May 1, 2024, LAFCo approved the adopting an addendum to DPMWD's Municipal Services Review and adopt a Resolution of Intent to Initiate Dissolution of DPMWD. The vote was 7-0 on both items.

If SSWD and DPMWD choose to continue the path of combining the two agencies, a list of necessary tasks needs to be developed. For example, State Water Resources Control Board, Division of Drinking Water (DDW) will need to initiate amending SSWD and DPMWD's Water System Permits, which typically takes approximately 6-12 months. However, during the Water System Permit amendment process, DDW can temporarily re-appoint DPMWD's Water System Permit to SSWD, which provides SSWD with the authority/responsibility to operate DPMWD's water system until the Water System Permit amendment process is completed.

In addition, there are several tasks that need to be outlined and assigned as priorities. Below is an example of various tasks that would need to be conducted if the process is approved by both districts:

- Financial System Determine how cash receivables and liabilities are transferred. Inventory non-bonded loans/grants, etc. Notify bond holders.
- Water Rates Determine rate setting process.
- LAFCo resolutions
- Insurance Claims/Litigation. Identify outstanding claims and litigation.
- Real property disposition inventory and transfer
- Vehicle and equipment inventory

Note: The above items are not in order of priority.

#### **Recommended Board Action:**

#### **Discussion:**

If the respective Board of Directors of Del Paso Manor Water District (DPMWD) and Sacramento Suburban Water District (SSWD) choose to initiate the process of reorganizing DPMWD into SSWD, it is imperative that a draft Communications Plan is developed that will reach internal and external stakeholders of each district. The Communications Plan, at a minimum, should address potential efficiencies, water supply reliability, and enhanced customer service. Attached to this staff report is a Draft Communications Plan that identifies outreach phases and options for communicating the discussions to internal and external stakeholders.

If DPMWD and SSWD choose to develop a Communication Plan, the cost of the effort will be split 50/50 between the two agencies.

#### **OUTREACH PHASES AT A GLANCE**

#### **PHASE 1: Reorganization discussion progress**

- Educate audiences that SSWD and DPMWD are in the process of a potential reorganization.
- Postcards, newsletter, website, bill inserts, etc.

#### PHASE 2: Once the SSWD and DPMWD Boards takes a position on reorganization:

- Educate audiences about the SSWD and DPMWD Board's position, and next steps.
  - If the Board's position is to move forward with reorganization, then outline next steps for Board action, including opportunities for audiences to learn more and provide input.
    - Recommend providing ample time, robust outreach and several opportunities for audiences to learn more and provide input.

#### **Discussion:**

The Del Paso Manor Water District (DPMWD) and Sacramento Suburban Water District (SSWD) conducted combination discussions from 2020 to 2023. During that timeframe, the DPMWD and SSWD Board of Directors chose to appoint a 2x2 Committee to receive the information and analysis provided by staff. The 2x2 Committee would then report back to the full Boards with recommendations, if appropriate.

However, the 2x2 Committee does not have the authority to approve critical points of a reorganization between the two districts. Due to this, a 2x2 Committee has the potential to delay important tasks throughout the process and can ultimately extend critical decision points.

In directing staff to schedule Joint Board meetings to present information, or critical decision points, the process is more efficient as all of the Directors of each district receive the same information and allows making decisions in a more timely manner.
