How Does It Work?

Follow these 3 easy steps:

- At home, remove, scratch off or black-out personal information from the containers.
- Remove pills from the container, place in a clear zipper bag. Recycle the container. Keep liquids and creams in original containers.
- 3. Place zipper bag, liquids and creams in the bin. It's that easy! 1-2-3!

Note: Medications should remain in the original child-proof container until just prior to drop-off.

What can I put in bins?

- Prescription medications (controlled medications accepted at specified locations)
- Over-the-counter medications
- Medicated ointments and lotions
- Pet medications

What can't go in bins?

- Dietary supplements
- Vitamins
- Sharps
- Mercury thermometers
- Medical devices (e.g., epi-pens, glucose monitors)
- Business waste (e.g., clinics, doctor's & dentist's offices, veterinarians)
